



Briefing for stakeholders #7

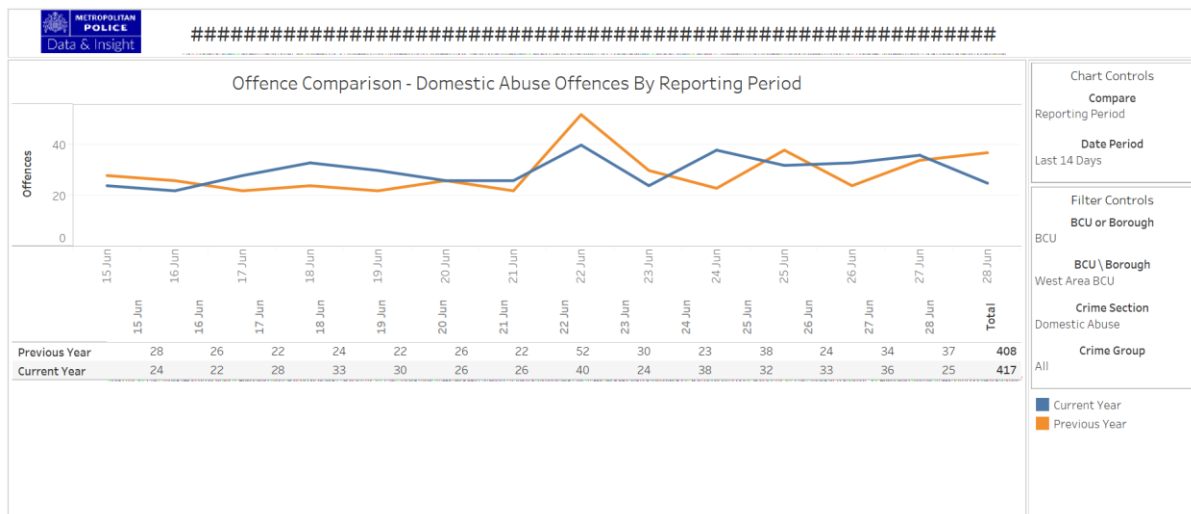
1. Recorded data

West Area BCU (to 28 June 2020):

The WA BCU shows an increase of Domestic Abuse offences from the previous week, from 189 to 228 offences. This reduction of 10 offences from the same week in the previous year.

In the past 2 weeks there has been a 2.2% increase in Domestic Abuse Offence, an increase of 9 offences; 417 offences compared to 408 for same 2 weeks last year.

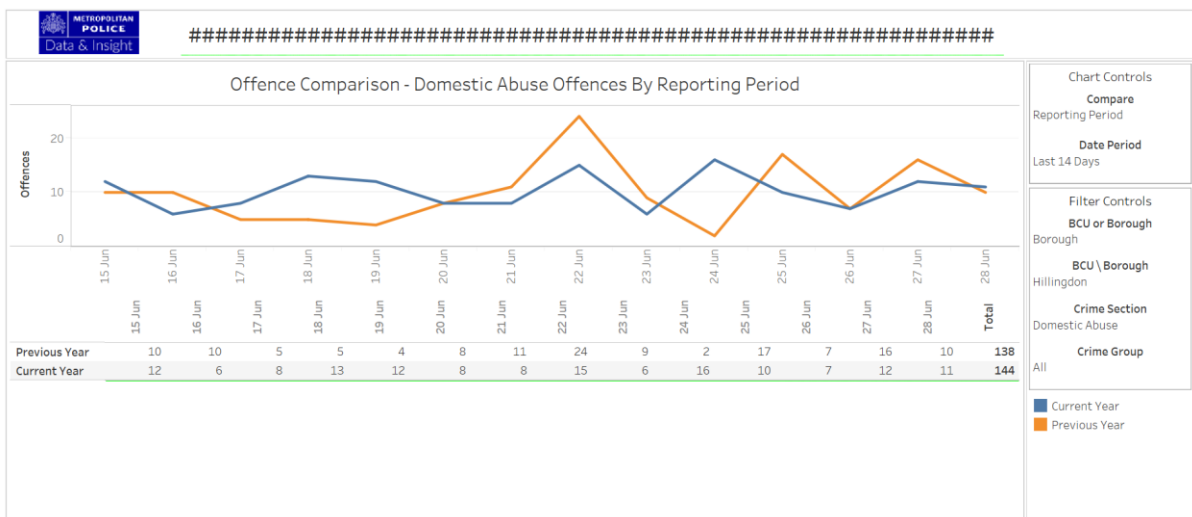
Please note that the numbers will fluctuate week on week due to late / delayed reporting.



Hillingdon Borough (data to 28 June 2020):

In the last week, there has been an increase in DA offences from the previous week – from 67 up to 77 offences reported. This is decrease from 85 offences recorded in the same period last year. Violence with Injury offences have increased from 14 offences up to 22 reports. This is an increase of two offences from the previous year.

In the past 2 weeks there has been an increase of 4.3% in DA offences in Hillingdon Borough. This is an increase in 6 offences (144 from 138 offences).



In addition, it is worth noting that the police data for Hillingdon Borough does NOT include the non-crime element, which invariably would be higher than the recorded DA Offence data.

Recommendation: That the wider partnership markets and broadcasts the availability of DA support services on the borough and across London and encourage the safe reporting of DA. Refer to the Local Resources Guide access via <https://hillingsdon.gov.uk/abuse>

Hillingdon IDVA Service

There were 44 referrals of high DA cases to the Hillingdon IDVA Service in the 2 weeks to June 21st. In the previous 2 weeks there were 27 referrals to this service.

In FY 2019/20 there were 777 referrals to this service. This represents an increase of 3.46% compared to FY 2018/19. This is the highest annual number of referrals managed by this service.

DA Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference (MARAC)

There have 32 high risk cases referred to the DA MARAC in the 2 weeks to June 21st compared to 17 referrals for the previous 2 weeks. The next 'remote' MARAC meeting is taking place on July 16th

The SafeLives data for FY 19/20 (April to March) shows that our local MARAC managed 518 referrals, which is an 11% increase. This compares to a London average increase of 4%.

Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH)

In the 2 weeks to June 28th the MASH has received 118 MERLIN reports with a Domestic Abuse safeguarding element, of which 91 involved children. Overall there is a 20 -25% increase in Merlin reports received in the MASH.

Further to the above the Government has announced a review of support in the workplace DA victims (9 June 2020). More details can be found here:

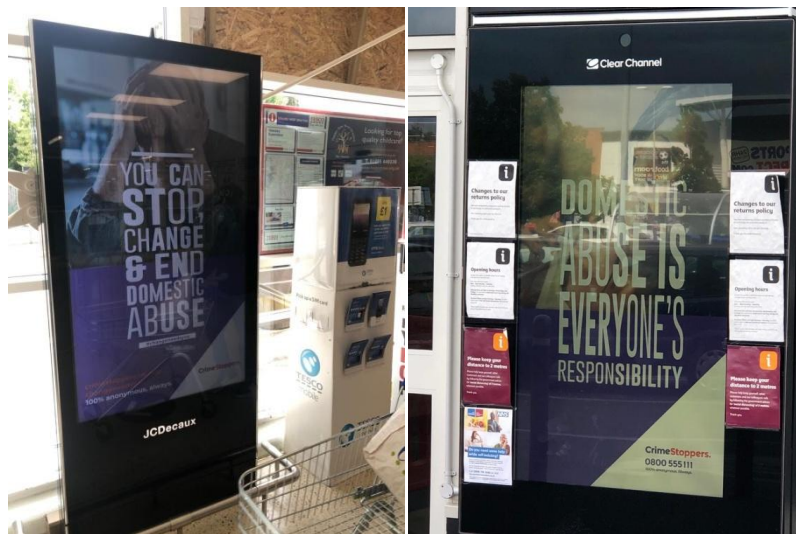
