

Adoption Statement

Planning Obligations Supplementary Planning Document July 2014

In accordance with Regulations 11 and 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, The London Borough of Hillingdon's Planning Obligations Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was adopted by resolution of full Council on 10 July 2014. The provisions of this document will apply from 01 August 2014.

Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the Supplementary Planning Document may make an application to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of the decision. Any such application must be made promptly, in any event no later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted.

Title of the SPD

The London Borough of Hillingdon Planning Obligations Supplementary Planning Document July 2014.

Subject matter and area covered

The SPD provides guidance on the use of planning obligations in Hillingdon, for all those involved in the submission and determination of planning applications. The document replaces the current Planning Obligations SPD, adopted by the Council on 15th July 2008.

Details of the modifications made as a result of the consultation process

A draft version of the SPD was made available for public comment in accordance with Regulation 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012. The responses to the consultation process did not result in the need for any significant changes to the Draft Planning Obligations SPD. The Council has prepared a separate Consultation Statement setting how the Draft SPD was amended in the light of consultation responses.
