Your council tax 2024/25

A message from Cllr Ian Edwards, Leader of Hillingdon Council



Dear resident,

The council approved its annual budget on 22 February, continuing to put residents first by further investing in services and keeping council tax at one of the lowest levels in Outer London.

Despite continuing pressures on local government finance, Hillingdon remains on a sound financial footing, with the council confirming a budget for 2024/25 that continues to invest in the delivery of services and transform and reshape how the authority works to ensure value for money.

To minimise the funding requirement from residents, the council's transformation programme saved £20.8 million last year, with a further £15.8 million earmarked for 2024/25.

Rather than cutting services, the council believes in changing them to deliver increased value for money for residents by looking at what money is being spent on and seeing if it can find more efficient ways of delivering them with the same or improved outcomes for less cost. This could be achieved by joining up services, investing in digital technologies, relocating services to make better use of buildings and commissioning specialist providers to deliver services on the council's behalf.







Residents are expected to once again pay amongst the lowest levels of council tax and fees and charges in Outer London. Core council tax will increase by 2.99 per cent and a levy of 2 per cent to fund residents' adult social care will also be charged. In practice, this equates to £1.27 a week for a Band D property. Fees and charges will be increased in line with inflation.




