


Briefing for stakeholders 4

1. Recorded data


In the last 2 weeks there has been an increase of 83 recorded crimes (+24.5%) - 421 DA Offences from 338 compared to the same 2 weeks in the previous 12 months.

West Area BCU:



Hillingdon Borough:

In the last 2 weeks there has been a more modest 5% increase in recorded DA offences compared to the same 2 weeks in the previous 12 months (124 recorded offences compared to 118)



In addition, it is worth noting that this police data does NOT include the non-crime element, which invariably would be higher than the DA Offence data.

Recommendation: That the wider partnership markets and broadcasts the availability of DA support services on the borough and across London and encourage the safe reporting of DA.

The Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) has reported is an average of 100 arrests for DA Offences per day.

Hillingdon IDVA Service

In April 2020 so far there have been 64 referrals to the IDVA Service. This 'mirrors' the 63 referrals in April 2019.

In the last 2 weeks (to May 10th) there were 28 referrals of high risk DA cases to the Hillingdon IDVA Service.

[In FY 2019/20 there were 777 referrals to this service. This represents an increase of 3.46% compared to FY 2018/19. This is the highest annual number of referrals managed by this service

Key points of note from the annual IDVA data:

There were 635 children in those DA abusive households/relationships, 30 referrals of victims affected by honour based abuse and/or forced marriage, 26 referrals involved 26 adult child offenders

Victims: 85.2% / 4.8% (female/male), 92 referrals related to people aged 16 - 24 years, 10 victims were aged 65 - 94 years, 130 victims were identified as having a mental health issue, 33 reported having a drugs and/or alcohol problem and 50 victims with a 50 physical disability.

Perpetrators: 100 people were reported to have mental health issues, 139 were reported to have problems with drugs and/or alcoholl.

(NB: the above information is that provided by the referee and based on their experiences and not from the perpetrators or healthcare diagnosis).

DA Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference (MARAC)

There have 23 high risk cases referred to the DA MARAC in the 2 weeks to May 10th. The next 'remote' MARAC meeting is on May 19th.

Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH)

In the 2 weeks to May 10th the MASH has received 101 MERLIN reports of which 72 have a DA element to them involving children.

There is a general upward trend in the number of MERLIN reports that have a DA element to them.

Helpline calls

We await the announcement of the borough breakdown of the use of the DA and Sexual Violence helpline.

Funded by London Councils, Women's Aid, Refuge, the Rape and Sexual Abuse Support Centre (RASASC), the Men's Advice Line (Respect) and the Women and Girls Network (WGN) are working together to deliver dedicated helpline services for all victims of domestic and sexual violence. This service includes men, boys and LGBT callers.

In Quarter 3 of Financial Year 2019/20 there were 173 callers who identified being resident in Hillingdon Borough; this is the 6th highest out of 33 borough areas in London (including the City of London area). This call rate volume is the 4th highest in London when measured per 1000 of the population.

CNWL data - Use of Section 136 Mental Health Act provisions

The provisions of section 136 Mental Health Act were used on 24 occasions in April 2020, which is a reduction from previous months. The gender mix was broadly similar to March i.e. approximately 2/3rds male and 1/3 female.


