## LONDON BOROUGH OF HILLINGDON SECTION 90 OF THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 THE HILLINGDON (SPEED LIMIT) (NO.) TRAFFIC ORDER 2017

Hillingdon Council gives notice that it proposes to make these Orders which will:

- 1. Convert the existing 40mph speed limit on Sipson Lane to 30mph speed limit, between Westfield Cottages and the east of the junction with Vineries Close.
- 2. Convert the existing 30mph speed limit on Sipson Lane to 20mph from a point east of the junction with Vineries Close up to the existing 20mph Zone at the junction with Sipson Road.
- 3. Install raised road tables 75mm high with 1:20 gradient ramps on each approach at the following locations along Sipson Lane:
  - i) To the east of the junction with Vineries Close where the speed limit changes.
  - ii) Approximately 22 metres west of Westfield Cottages.
- 4. Install pairs of speed cushions 75mm high with 1:20 gradient ramps on each approach at the following locations along Sipson Lane:
  - i) To the west of the western abutment of bridge over the M4 motorway.
  - ii) To the east of the eastern abutment of bridge over the M4 motorway.
  - iii) To the west of the entrance with Wall Garden Farm.
  - iv) To the west of the access road leading to Sipson Quarry
  - v) Approximately 40 metres to the east of the access road leading to Sipson Quarry
