  - iii) Outside No. 156 Rowan Road, West Drayton
  - iv) At eastern most junction of Rowan Road and Wise Lane, West Drayton
- 4. Install a new bus lay-by outside Nos. 2 to 14 Laurel Lane, West Drayton.
- 5. Impose 'at any time' waiting restrictions in sections of road as set out in the Schedule to this notice.





# WESTWOOD CLOSE, RUISLIP

i) The northeast to southwest arm southeast of Nos. 43 to 47 Westwood Close - From a point 2.3 metres southwest of the common boundary of Nos. 46 and 47 Westwood Close, northeastwards to the northeastern extremity returning on the northeast side to a point in line with the common boundary of Nos. 44 and 45 Westwood Close.

ii)The northeast to southwest arm southeast of Nos. 67 to 71 Westwood Close, From a point 1.3 metres northeast of the southwestern boundary of No. 67 Westwood Close, northeastwards to the northeastern extremity returning on the northeast side to a point 7.5 metres southwest of the common boundary of Nos. 69 and 70 Westwood Close.

iii) Northwest side, from a point 10 southwest of the southwestern kerbline of Ladygate Lane southwestwards for a distance of 31 metres.

## STATEMENT OF REASONS

This proposed waiting restriction will stop obstructive parking and improve road safety. Therefore it is recommended to commence statutory consultation to introduce waiting restrictions in Westwood Close.
