

THE HILLINGDON (TROUT ROAD,) WEIGHT RESTRICTION ORDER 201? Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hillingdon propose to make the above mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by section 8 and schedule 5 of the Local Government Act 1985.
