## **Adoption Statement** **`Accessible Hillingdon` Supplementary Planning Document**

In accordance with Regulation 35 of The Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, Hillingdon Council gives notice that the `Accessible Hillingdon` Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) was formally adopted on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2017.

Accessible Hillingdon sets out how the Council seeks to ensure that accessibility considerations form an integral part of new and existing buildings and environments. The SPD supports the Council's goal to ensure that all new and existing buildings, including housing developments, are accessible to all. The SPD is now a material consideration in the assessment and determination of relevant planning applications. Appended to the SPD is the Consultation Statement. The SPD will be subject to the monitoring process that is required under The Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012. In light of the continuing development of the Council's Local Plan, the `Accessible Hillingdon` SPD may be subject to further review.

The Consultation Statement contains the main issues derived from the consultation processes, which preceded adoption of the SPD, and how these were addressed in the adopted SPD. It details how the consultation process was handled and a summary of those consulted.

Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the `Accessible Hillingdon` SPD may apply to the High Court for permission for a judicial review of the Council's decision to adopt the SPD. Any judicial review application must be made on the grounds that the document has not been prepared in accordance with The Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, or that a requirement of the Act or associated Regulations have not been correctly followed. Any such application must be made no later than 24<sup>th</sup> August 2018

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
