An anthem for Hillingdon

Hillingdon Council's Music Hub brought together more than 300 community singers and performers of all ages, abilities and cultural backgrounds to create the first multimedia performance of original material themed around Hillingdon.

The concert project called 'Anthem! a borough sings...' explored and celebrated the history of Hillingdon and its residents, all drawn from their real life experiences both past and present.

Lyricists and songwriters created original songs which were performed by children from participating schools and several community groups, with special guests being the RAF Marching band for the finale in front of the Mayor of Hillingdon.
