Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation

Architectural: C 1914. Two storey, in render with tiled roof. Symmetrical, the entrance on front elevation with half timbered centrepiece. Two half timbered gables on rear elevation, fronting onto the grounds, attractive veranda with brick piers. Hipped roof dormers to rear.

Townscape: Contributes to local character and street scene.

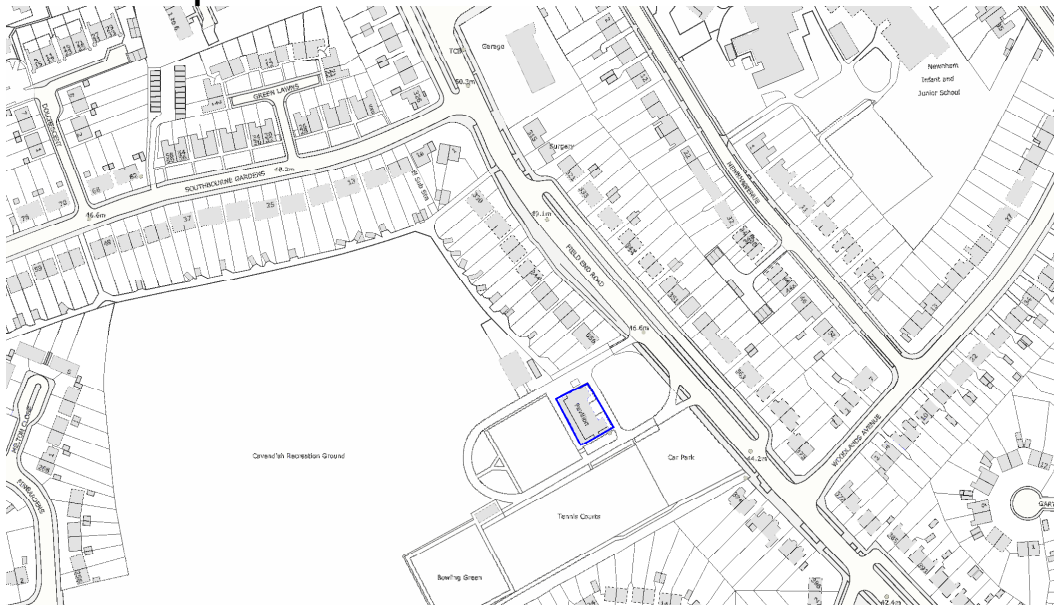
Historical: Built for staff recreation by Debenhams; attractive and rare example of this type of building.
