**Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation**

Architectural: Late 18th or early 19<sup>th</sup> century, two storey house set in large grounds. Rendered south elevation of brick construction, with stone capped parapet, partly concealing a pitched clay tiled roof. Attractive veranda with metal arched supports, roof renewed in corrugated iron, over multi-paned curved bay windows at ground floor. French doors with arched fan-light to the centre at ground floor. Side and rear elevations later and in brick. Double-hung sashes with glazing bars.

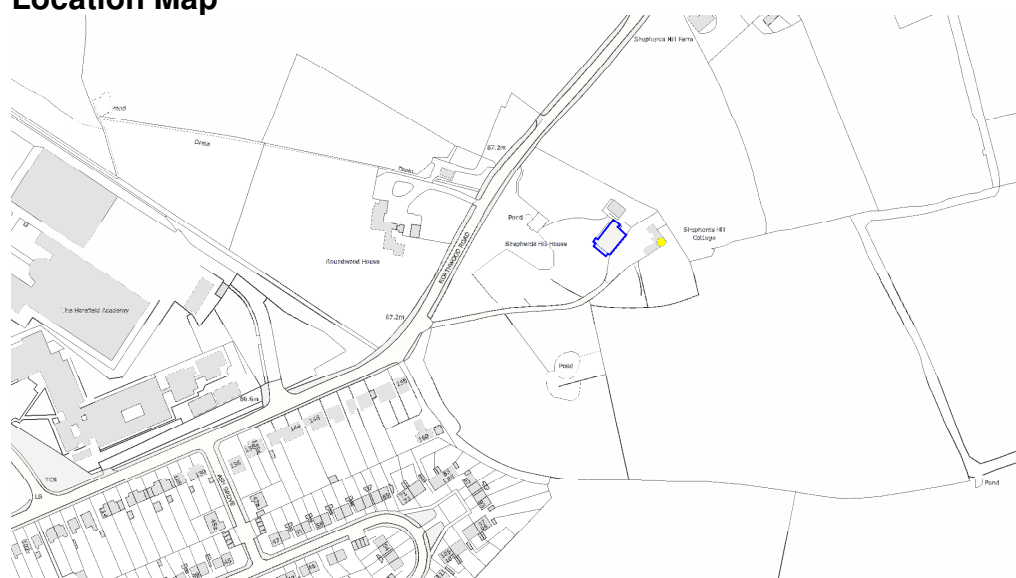
Townscape: Picturesque setting. Contributes to local character.

Historic: Formerly known as Dower House, the house was used as a Nurses' Home after the Second World War and later converted to Residential Study Centre for Primary School children in 1986.
