Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation

Architectural: House of two builds, at right mid-late 18th century house (fishing lodge) of two storeys. Tiled roof, with steep pitch to front and two gabled dormers with fancy bargeboards. Walls pebble-dashed and painted. Left wing, Victorian water mill, of two storeys in yellow brick. Machine tiled roof with boarded gable at right. Ground floor loggia.

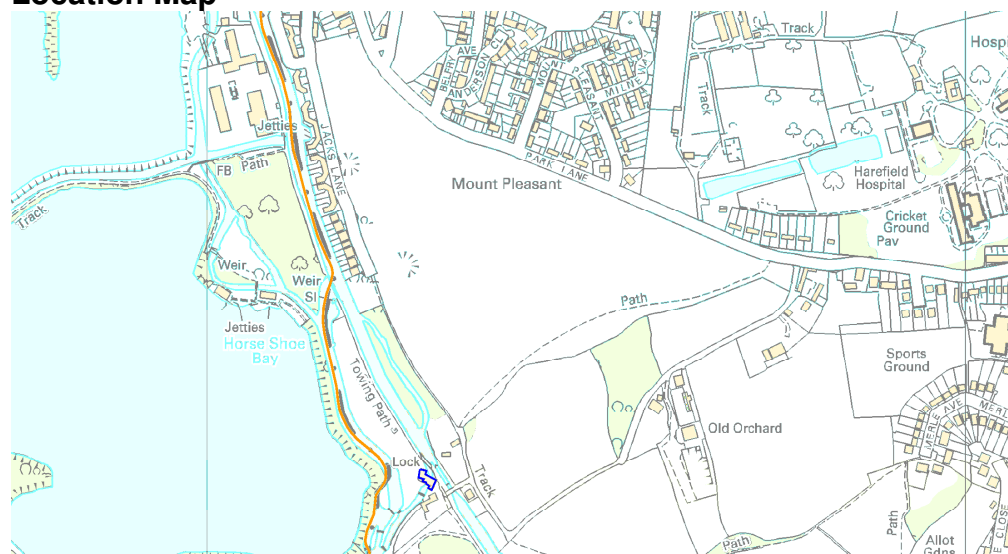
Townscape: Group Value, Landmark - stands on an island between two waterways, reached by an attractive arched canal bridge.

Historical: Originally known as Jack's Mill- used till 1908 as Corn mill and paper mill.
