Statement of significance/Reasons for designation

<u>Architectural</u>: Circa 1970. Two storeys in brick, render and mock timber framing. Picturesque front elevation with two asymmetric gables, and dormers to front and side. Attractive timber entrance porch with cat-slide roof.

<u>Townscape</u>: Contributes to local character. <u>Historical</u>: Captain A. Morris Davies of Clack Farm collected old timber, tiles, doors, firebacks etc from houses and other

buildings that were being demolished in the 1920s and 30s. He incorporated them in a group of houses he built in a field belonging to Clack Farm, which he called Tile Kiln Hamlet. There were originally 8 houses in all, and the part of Tile Kiln Lane where the hamlet is situated, was renamed Old Priory.
