Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation




Architectural: 1851, substantial building. Part of an old 16th C house called Maze Farm. Rebuilt in Victorian Gothic style. Only some parts of the original house survive. Two storeys and attic. In stock brick with steep tiled roof, now renewed. Gable to front elevation with barge boarding. Entrance through a two storey porch in white render, arched doorway with fanlight and rusticated pilasters. Doorway mounted by rendered balcony with relief work. Bay window on first floor. Flat stock brick arches over other windows, mostly modern casements. Attractive chimneys.

Historical: Part of Maze Farmhouse, owned by the renowned judge, Sir John Vaughan in C18. Rebuilt by Daniel Norton, C19, then called Northwood Hall. Bought by Alfred Denville, actor-manager and MP in 1925. The hall was renamed Denville Hall, and opened fully in 1926 as a home for retired actors and actresses. Now owned by the Actors' Charitable Trust. Heavily extended since then. Site may have archaeological importance.
