

Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation

Architectural: Traditional cast iron pump with decorative top and plain handle. Painted in black

<u>Townscape</u>: Key landmark at this important junction. Street feature contributing to local character.

Historical: Pump placed over a well sunk by Charles Page of Uxbridge Moor, an artesian well sinker, at junction of High Street and Bury Street in 1864. Moved to side of Manor Farm Lodge 1972 and moved again in 1982 to its present position in the courtyard of the Ruislip Village Trust property 7-15 High Street.
