**Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation**

Architectural: Designed by F.H. Mansford, who lived in no 15. The semi-detached pair has been deliberately made to look like a single house, to comply with the requirements of King's College.

Townscape: Key Landmark building, part of King's College's Garden Suburb Plan, one of the earliest in Hillingdon.

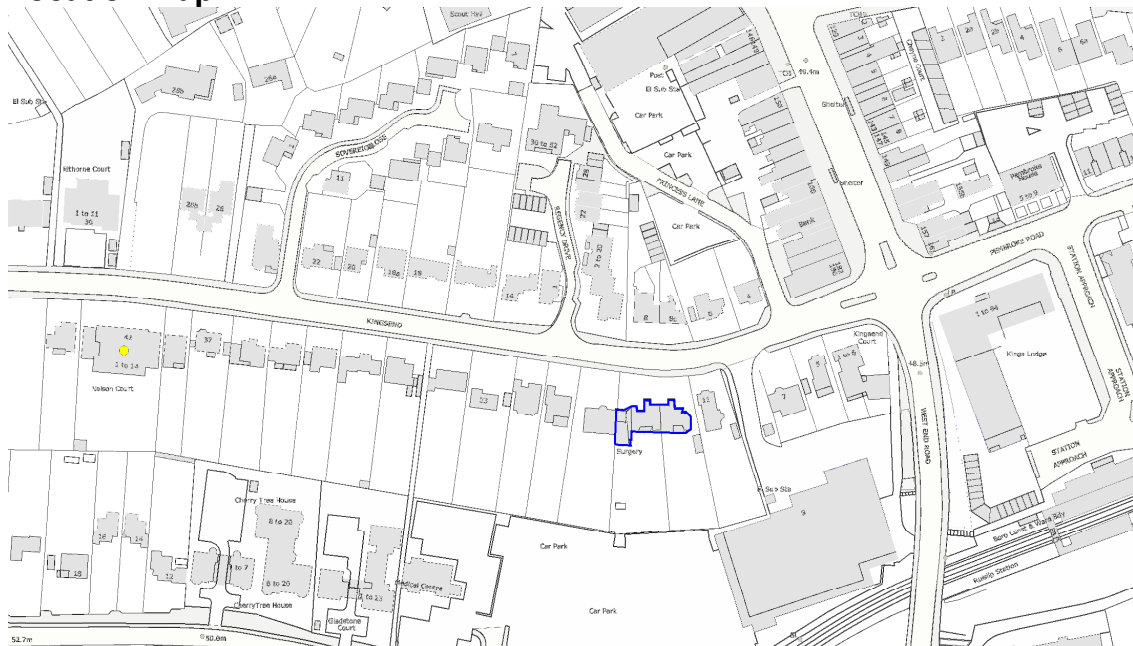
Historic: The new avenue called King's End was driven through demesne pasture called Wythcrofts in 1905. King's College had owned the land since the 15th century.
