Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation

Architectural: Circa 18th century with alterations. Painted brick with parapet and hipped plain tiled roof. Two storeys, four windows wide, outer two slightly projecting with full height canted bays. Single storey canted bay to left of main entrance. Windows all replaced sashes with glazing bars. Door under bracketed hood. It is thought that the building may contain an

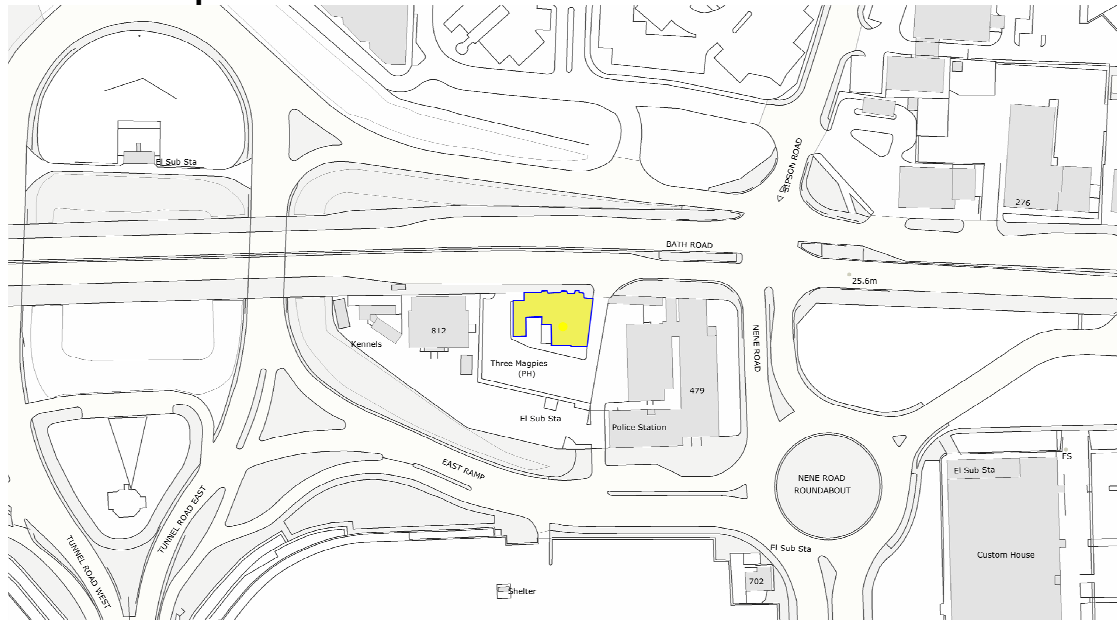
older core, but nothing is visible inside, although there is some imported oak panelling.

Townscape: Prominent location, key landmark, contributes to street scene and local character.

Historic: Known as the “Three Pigeons” in 1765 it is the only survivor of the many inns that once lined the Bath Road.
