




Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation

Architectural: Group of buildings including the Physics, Mathematical Sciences, Biology, Chemistry, Biochemistry and Engineering Buildings (Stillman and Eastwick-Fields, 1969-71). Long blocks with bays articulated by projecting uprights. They form an imposingly massive square with projecting upper floors, partly open on the ground floor to a central courtyard. Around this is an L-shaped group with four towers cantilevered out over lower link buildings. Expanses of shuttered concrete are relieved by the glazed links with a repeating pattern of corner beams cutting into the building, simply arranged. Historic: Community and social significance.
