Statement of significance/ Reasons for designation

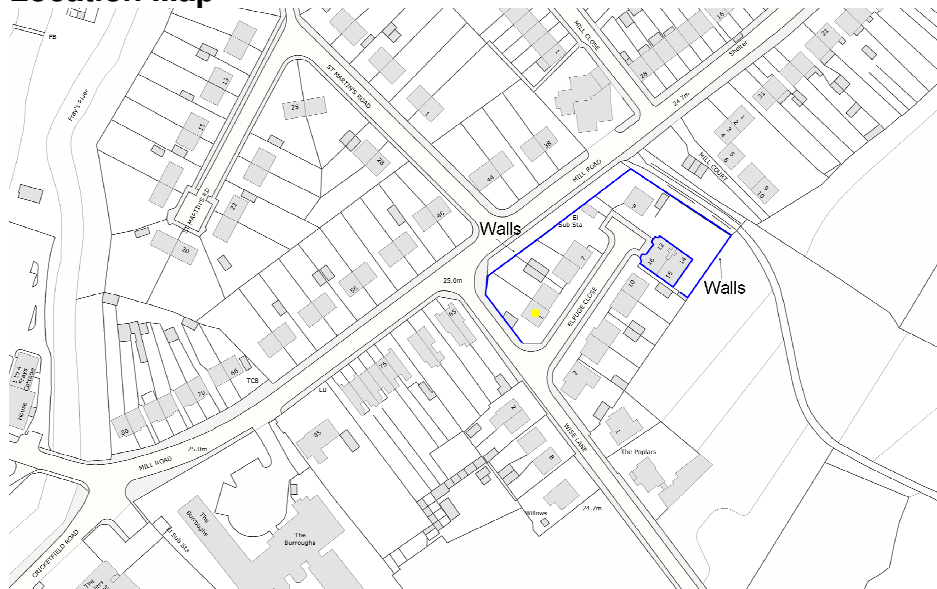
Architecture: Mid 19th century Victorian villa. Two storey, stock brick, shallow hipped slate roof with over-sailing eaves. Two storey canted bays to front elevation. Central arched entrance now blocked. Attractive projecting brick banding between ground and first floors. Two storey cast iron porch, with latticed balcony to the first floor. Guaged brick arches over windows. Two remaining original sash windows, one on each side elevation, all others replaced. Wall partly rebuilt when grounds of the house were sold. Associated with Elruge House. Stock brick

Townscape: Contributes to the local character and street scene.

Historical: The General Manager of the Great Western Railway lived here from 1912 to 1919.
