

 - i) On Bourne Avenue, 65 metres west of the junction with Carnarvon Drive;
 - ii) On Bourne Avenue, 18 metres southwest from the junction with Skipton Drive;
 - iii) On Skipton Drive at the junction with Bourne Avenue
 - vi) On Nine Acres Close at junction with Bourne Avenue.
- 2. Introduce a 7.5 tonne weight limit on the entire section of Bourne Avenue, Hayes west of the junction with Carnarvon Drive.

The London Borough of Hillingdon after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984¹ as amended by Section 8 and Schedule 5 of the Local Government Act 1985² and all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on ??????? and may be cited as The Hillingdon (Prescribed Routes) (No. ??) Traffic Order 2021.
- 2. In this order -

"prescribed street" means – that length of street in the London Borough of Hillingdon specified in Schedule 1 of this Order

"maximum gross weight" means -

(a) in relation to a vehicle not drawing a trailer, means the maximum gross weight as defined in regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations³; and

- (b) in relation to a vehicle drawing one or more trailers, the total weight obtained by taking the maximum gross weight (as so defined) of each vehicle in the combination and adding them together.
- 3. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle the maximum weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes to enter or proceed on the entire section of Bourne Avenue, Hayes that lies west of the western kerbline of Carnarvon Drive.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply:-
 - (a) in relation to any vehicle when used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for that vehicle to enter the prescribed street; or
 - (b) in relation to any vehicle being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, cleansing or lighting of the prescribed street, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer thereunder or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication system thereunder or thereon, or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign thereon; or
 - (c) to anything done with permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform; or
 - (d) to any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs places pursuant to Section 66 or Section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984
 - (e) for the purpose of delivery or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicles at premises adjacent to the street.
