



Dear resident,

With the extension of government restrictions and cases of the Delta variant spreading in England, I urge residents to keep following the latest guidance to protect themselves and others to help control the spread of COVID-19.

Please remember Hands. Face. Space. Fresh Air by continuing to wash your hands, avoiding touching your face, wearing a mask, social distancing and meeting in the fresh air you can help to keep everyone safe. It is also important to get tested regularly and you are encouraged to take the vaccine when you are eligible.

The second dose of the vaccine is especially important as it provides you with stronger and longer lasting protection. It is important that everyone gets two doses.



### Guidance on booking your first and second vaccination

Vaccination uptake across Hillingdon continues to gather pace. The NHS programme has now seen more than 290,555 first and second doses being given to Hillingdon residents. This is impressive – thank you to those who have come forward.

The vaccine is safe and effective and offers you the best protection against coronavirus - please consider taking it when it's your turn.

Those aged 18 or over and those turning 18 before Thursday 1 July can book their vaccine along with the other priority groups via the national booking system.

In addition, residents aged between 40 to 55 are now eligible to receive their second dose and should have received a text message from their GP.

If you have already had your first dose, please book your second vaccination as soon as you can. Your second dose will ensure you have stronger and longer lasting protection.



## Step four out of lockdown - update

On Monday 14 June, the government announced that stage four of its roadmap out of lockdown would be delayed by up to four weeks from Monday 21 June to Monday 19 July (subject to infection rates and hospitalisation figures).

Rules ordering the wearing of face coverings in enclosed public spaces, limiting groups to six people indoors and 30 outdoors, and keeping nightclubs shut remain in place while the government monitors the spread of the Delta variant and delivers more first and second doses of the vaccine.

Residents are encouraged to follow social distancing guidelines and take the vaccine when offered to help keep Hillingdon safe.

## Sign up for a new MyAccount today


The council has launched a brand-new online MyAccount that allows you to view and check the status of reports and requests in one place, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Registration is done via the council's website and is quick and easy. Simply enter your email address and follow the instructions to verify your account and set up a password.

If you used the old 'do it online' system, which has now been switched off, please register for a new MyAccount. If you log on to the old system, you will be redirected.

The way you can report issues and make requests, including applying or booking some of our services, has also changed. Use the search box on our website to find our services and complete one of our new-look online forms. While you don't need a MyAccount to report fly-tipping, request recycling bags, tell us about a problem in a road, or something else entirely, reporting it via the new online portal provides you with real-time updates on your query.

The new online services are part of the council's long-term plan to maximise the use of digital platforms for the benefit of residents.

## Introducing the new Mayor of Hillingdon

Cllr Roy Chamdal was elected Mayor of Hillingdon at the council's Annual General Meeting last month. He replaces retiring Mayor, Cllr Teji Barnes, in the prestigious role to highlight positive work taking place across the borough. The Mayoress is Reeta Chamdal, and the Mayor's Escort is Evangeline Chamdal.

His chosen charities are Domestic Abuse Survivors (DAS) and the Navratri Garba, which he will be raising money for through a range of activities throughout the year.

He chose DAS due to the rise in domestic abuse incidents during the pandemic and was impressed by how they cared for those who turned to them for support.

Navratri Garba provides free food to those most in need. Cllr Chamdal was inspired by how the charity supports the wider community. He hopes to raise awareness of the extraordinary work that both these charities do for residents.

## Apply now for the Tashan Daniel bursary scheme

Young people in Hillingdon can apply for the next round of the Tashan Daniel Award bursary from Monday 28 June until Sunday 11 July, to support their aspirations in sport, culture and education.

The council created the award in memory of young resident Tashan Daniel, aged 20 from Hillingdon, who was tragically killed in an unprovoked attack at Hillingdon Underground station in September 2019.

The memorial bursary is available to Hillingdon residents up to the age of 21, and council funding will be allocated to successful applicants for requests including sports equipment, qualifications in art and culture, vocational courses in further education, and sports training and competing opportunities (in the UK only).
