iii) Install a 75mm high raised table with 1:20 gradient ramps on Beaconsfield Road at the site of the existing zebra crossing.





The Council of the London Borough of Hillingdon (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Section 32 and Section 35 (1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Parts III and IV of Schedule 9 to the Act and Section 115 of the Highways Act 1980 and all other powers enabling it in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the said Act hereby makes the following Order.

1. COMMENCEMENT AND CITATION

This Order shall come into operation on the XXXXXX and may be cited as the London Borough of Hillingdon (Off Street Parking Places) Order 1985 (Amendment No. XX) 2022.

2. INTERPRETATION

In this Order:

- a) The expression "Order of 1985" means the London Borough of Hillingdon (Off Street Parking Places Order) 1985 as amended by the Variation and amendment Orders;
- b) The Hillingdon (Off Street Parking Places) Order 1985 (Variation No. 27) 2007 is hereby revoked.
- c) The description "Grainges Yard Car Park, Uxbridge" means that area shown on the plan titled Grainges Yard Car Park, Uxbridge attached to this Order.

3. AMENDMENT TO THE ORDER

The London Borough of Hillingdon (Off Street Parking Places) Order 1985 shall have effect as though:-

- a) The car park named as "Grainges Yard Car Park, Uxbridge" was added to the schedule of that Order as set out in Schedule 1 of this Order;
- b) There was added to that Order the plan titled "Granges Yard Car Park, Uxbridge" attached to this Order.
- c) There was added to Article 2 (1) of that Order the definitions set out in Article 2 (1) in Schedule 2 of this Order.
- d) For the sub-items (1) and (4) of Article 4 of that Order were substituted by the sub-items numbered the same as set out in Schedule 2 of this Order.



SCHEDULE 2

AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLES

2. (1) "cashless payment system" means a computerised system operated by the Council or authorised agent which facilitates, records and monitors details pertaining to time-related parking charges which have been paid by the use of an electronic communications network, and which can transmit data to and receive data from hand-held devices;

"vehicle registration mark" means the collection of letters and numbers displayed in such manner as set out within The Road Vehicles (Display of Registration Marks) Regulations 2001

4. Use of Parking Places

(1) The appropriate charge for any period during the prescribed hours for any class of vehicle left in a parking place is shown in the respective columns of the Schedule of car park charges. The charges applicable with the use of a HillingdonFirst Card shall only be available to residents issued with a card in accordance with the Council's conditions for its use and ownership. These charges can only be accessed from the ticket parking machine with the use of the card by following instructions on the ticket parking machine or via the cashless payment system. Standard charges will apply to all other persons leaving a vehicle in a parking place.

(4) For the purposes of this Order a parking ticket shall be a ticket obtained from a mechanical device approved in accordance with section 35(3) of the Act, at the parking place, at the charge and for the period specified in the said schedule or by the use of the cashless payment system if the availability of that facility is indicated on the ticket parking machine relating to that car park. The vehicle registration mark for the vehicle must be entered correctly into the ticket machine or by the cashless payment system at the time the ticket is obtained. Should the facility to enter the vehicle registration mark not be available on that ticket machine then the ticket will continue to be valid.
